For the second year in a row, Paxton partnered with Maersk and the American Turkish Friendship Association in a blanket drive for Syrian refugees. Donating nine trailer loads with over 4,900 boxes, Paxton's contribution was part of 14 containers of over 144,000 pounds of donated blankets and clothing items sent to Turkey this year, nearly tripling the donated materials from the previous year. Partners KYM in Adana, Turkey, distributed the blankets and clothing among the refugees living in various cities in the region.

According to an article in the Loudon Times-Mirror, if the boxes containing the goods were stacked on top of each other they would exceed 1 mile in height, or the equivalent of more than 16 Statues of Liberty stacked on top of each other. For Robert Lazarro of the Northern Virginia Regional Commission, seeing the faces of the children and families benefiting from these donations is by far the greatest gift.
